Grant Funding

The Buckley Senior Citizens have been awarded \$7,956 in operational funding from Pierce County Community Connections for the 2012 year. This funding is on a two year cycle-- so provid-

ed funds remain available in the Pierce County's general fund we will receive the same allocation in 2013. These funds will primarily be used to subsidize janitorial and utilities costs for the Cen-

ter.

About the Buckley Senior Center

The Buckley Senior Center is open to all men and women 55 and older in the greater Buckley area.

The Center had its beginnings with an informal group of senior citizens who met regularly for companionship and recreation in one of several places in downtown Buckley during the late 1960's and early 1970's. It was through the acquisition of state funding and federal Housing and Urban Development monies administered by the Pierce County community development block grant program, the Buckley Multi-Purpose Center was built in 1979. This enabled the Buckley Senior Citizens to have an

unchanging and publicly supported facility and place to meet. The group went on to attain its non-profit status in November of 1990. Buckley Senior Citizens' mission statement reads: **“the purpose of this organization shall be to encourage senior citizens to enhance their dignity, support their independence, and encourage their involvement in the community through their participation in health and nutrition programs and services, and through educational, social, and recreational classes and activities. Buckley Senior Citizens strive to promote a home-like atmosphere at the Center for recreation and companionship.”**

City of Buckley Offers Utilities Discounts to Low Income Seniors and Persons with Disabilities

Eligibility Requirements: In order to be eligible for a Utility Discount, you must be a low income household as defined by the following;

Low Income: Means a household earning less than eighty percent (80%) of the “very low income” threshold listed in the most current years Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Official Income Guidelines for Tacoma. For discounts on your utility rates, the income eligibility levels are as follows:

Household Size

Annual Gross Income

One Person	\$27,788 or below
Two Persons	\$31,763 or below
Three Persons	\$35,738 or below
Four Persons	\$39,713 or below
Five or more	See Information Sheet

Discount Request Procedure: In order to verify eligibility, you MUST provide the following documentation.

- ◆ A copy of your Federal income tax return or Social Security Administration form SSA1099.
- ◆ A list of names of all occupants residing in the household.
- ◆ Evidence or documentation confirming residency in the City of Buckley.
- ◆ List of individuals in household with Income from any source including amount and tax return.
- ◆ Complete Application Packet, sign the forms and return it and the required documentation to the City of Buckley.
