

RESOLUTION NO. 14-13

CITY OF BUCKLEY, WASHINGTON

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUCKLEY, PIERCE COUNTY, WASHINGTON DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTY AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING ITS SALE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Buckley intends to declare twelve (12) various forfeited firearms as surplus; and

WHEREAS, the Buckley City Council deems it appropriate and in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare for weapons to be transferred for this purpose: and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BUCKLEY:


All firearms taken into the custody of the Buckley Police Department on or after July 1, 1993 and that are judicially forfeited or forfeited due to a failure to make a claim under RCW63.32.010 are to be disposed of as follows:

- A. The Buckley Police Department may retain legal firearms for agency use;
- B. The Chief of Police, or his/her designee, may auction or trade legal firearms to properly licensed commercial sellers, as deemed appropriate by the Chief of Police or his/her designee. All proceeds of an auction or trade may be retained by the Buckley Police Department for agency use;
- C. The Chief of Police, or his/her designee, may destroy legal firearms in lieu of A or B, at the discretion of the Chief of Police;
- D. Firearms determined by the Chief of Police or his/her designee to be illegal for any person to possess may be destroyed;
- E. No firearm shall be disposed of while it is needed for evidence;
- F. The Buckley Police Department may, at the discretion of the Chief of Police, or his/her designee, transfer disposable firearms to a state or federal law enforcement agency such as the Washington State Patrol, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, Federal Bureau of Investigation or Naval Criminal Investigative Service, so long as such transfer is supported by an agreement between the parties that the transferee agency will store the firearms securely and will not sell, loan or otherwise transfer the firearms from its custody;
- G. The Chief of Police, or his/her designee, may trade for in store credit at a licensed firearm dealer.


