What does Drop-In look like?

Come hang out with us! Drop-In at the BYAC is a time and a place for kids to do just that – hang out. Since opening in 2008, we have offered a variety of free and low-cost programs and activities for youth. Our purpose is to facilitate youth-led programing; meaning staff supports and encourages individuals as well as groups of like-minded participants to create and engage with activities in which they are organically passionate. This is an self-agency building strategy that allows staff and volunteers to provide educational and logistical recourses as a platform for these activities to develop into real life skills in the lives of our participants. Drop-In is often loud, fun chaos and is the perfect time to remember that disorder does not mean disaster!

Who can come?

Youth ages 8-18 may join us, without fee, regardless of residence within the city limits. Those under the age of 8 are asked to be accompanied by an adult. The average participant demographic during school months are middle and high school students, while the summer months include a much younger crowd and their caregivers. We serve nearly 700 participants from the White River School district and surrounding areas. Participants are required to complete membership forms, which are kept on file for emergency purposes. Volunteers are required to fill out an application and are background checked. These forms can be found on the City of Buckley website or at our front desk.

How does it work?

Walk in, sign in, say hello, have fun! The Youth Center has naturally fostered and evolved into it's own system of encouraging appropriate behavior – we call this our *Culture of Honor*. All participants are treated with respect, grace, and genuine interest and are expected to act justly in return. Our rules and expectations are posted on the wall for all to see, however, it is generally our participants who guide and govern each other regarding daily interactions, with support of staff.

How can you help?

Drop-In activities consists of volunteer assisted activities such as homework help, guitar and ukulele lessons, chess tournaments, art demonstrations, woodworking and so if you have a passion to instruct the next generation in a meaningful pursuit, bring us your ideas! If you would rather contribute your time just hanging out and being a fun positive role model, there is also access to a pool table, air hockey, computers, and gaming consoles, etc., all of which are received on donation. Currently, donations are needed for snacks: bread, hard boiled eggs, microwave Mac N Cheese, Top Ramen, Cup Noodles, hot chocolate, fresh fruits and vegetables; as well as raffle prizes for our events, and crafting art supplies.
