

**City Council
September 13, 2016**

Mayor Pro Tem Tremblay called the regularly scheduled meeting to order at 7:02 PM.

Upon roll call the following members were present: Sundstrom, Rose, B. Burkett, S. Burkett, Boyle Barrett and Leggett. Also in attendance were City Administrator Schmidt, Police Chief Arsanto, Police Officer Garrett, Police 10Officer Berg, and City Clerk Starr.

Council member Leggett moved to accept the Agenda as presented. Council member Boyle Barrett seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mr. Schwab discussed parking problems at the White River Senior Housing. He stated that a sign is needed to designate visitor parking and he believes a letter should go out to all residents asking them to inform their guests where they can park.

STAFF REPORTS

City Administrator Schmidt stated that the Rainier Foothills Wellness Foundation would like to once again place silhouettes around town in support of domestic violence awareness. **Council member Sundstrom moved to approve the placement of silhouettes for domestic violence awareness. Council member Boyle Barrett seconded the motion. Motion carried.** City Administrator Schmidt stated that Doxsa CrossFit has expressed an interest in purchasing the old Police Station building and submitted a letter of intent which everyone received tonight. **Council member Sundstrom moved to direct the City Administrator to seek an appraisal on the old Police Station building. Council member Boyle Barrett seconded the motion. Motion carried.** City Administrator Schmidt stated that he has received three bids for repairs to the old fire station and this may be discussed in Executive Session at the next meeting. Also, regarding the Realignment Project, work and paving on new accesses to the Econo Lodge and the Mexican restaurant will begin soon, and some of the paving will happen at night. He will do a Public Notice so citizens are informed about the work.

Council member Rose moved to direct City staff and the attorney to prepare a PSA for the purchase of the building at 117 N. River Avenue (former Del's Farm Supply) for the full market value less the cost of repairs. Council member Boyle Barrett seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Council Member Comments & Good of the Order:


