# NOTICE UTILITY RATE CHANGES FOR 2019

After review and adoption of the City's 2019 Budget the City Council has made the following changes to utility rates for 2019.

### Water:

To adequately fund operations and capital replacement adjustments for basic service will increase by 6.5% for all meter sizes and consumption rates for all usage tiers by 1.5% as follows:

#### Water rates and charges

A. 1. For the base (minimum) service, including water usage from zero to 200 cubic feet per month according to meter size and location within the corporate limits of the city:

2. Users outside the city limits shall pay the monthly charges set forth in subsections A(1) and B(1) of this section plus a surcharge of 20 percent of the total charge.

B. 1. For usage above 200 cubic feet, the following rates are imposed for each 100 cubic feet of usage according to location within or without the corporate limits of the city:

To adequately fund operations and capital replacement adjustments a 5.0% increase in the rates for the stormwater utility is needed as follows:
